#### **Make Checks Out to Woodmar**

Please make out your offering checks to Woodmar until the end of year. Consolidating two churches into a third, new church is a complicated process. We continue to receive bills for both Woodmar and First. New accounts need to be set up with our vendors and utilities for Hope UMC and that will be an ongoing process for a couple of months. In the meantime, to maintain clarity on our financial situation and keep things simple, it makes sense to pay all bills out of just one of the previous church's bank accounts until all the billing accounts for Hope UMC are set up.

To make this transitional period as smooth as possible, please make out the checks for your offering to Woodmar UMC until the end of the year, or until we give you different guidance. This will help us to have all our accounting and giving data in one system until we are in a position to begin fully operating as Hope UMC.

#### **Priority of Transitioning to Hope UMC**

As we build a firm foundation for Hope UMC, we must pull together to prepare the property of First UMC for sale. Maintaining two properties is not sustainable in our current financial state. Teams have been determining which items will be transferred to Hope UMC. Moving those items has begun, but there is still much to be moved. ## <u>Thoughts from Pastor Jim</u>

Hope United Methodist Church is a Sacred Community rooted in faith, hope, and love where people experience God's love and grace in Jesus Christ. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we Learn, Love, Go, and Act to unite people, bring peace and justice, and share God's love to our community and the world.

This is the vision statement of Hope United Methodist Church. By its nature, a vision statement is an aspiration, a hope, for what we may become. Yet this is not just a nice sounding wish for an ideal future, a vision statement is a guide for us in the present. As we are in these early days of becoming Hope United Methodist Church and figuring out who we are and how to act, our vision statement will guide us.

First, each one of us is called to be rooted in faith. The key to a vibrant future for Hope UMC is for each of us to be seriously working on our faith development. Faith is not just a strong belief, it is a reliance on God in all that we do. The amazing thing about faith is that it is alive and it must be fed through study, prayer, and service. If we are not actively feeding our faith, it will wither and die even if we still believe just as strongly as ever!

Second, we are called to be hopeful. Hope is not wishful thinking at all. Hope arises out of a strong faith. Hope is what lets us live into the future that God is calling us toward. To cultivate hope we must take risks. Hope grows when we act in faith and experience God's blessings. Hope keeps us going even when our best efforts seem to be fruitless, because hope arises out of God's nature and not our successes.

Third, we are called to love. I refer you to 1 Corinthians 13. Paul says it better than I ever could. Test yourself daily to see if you are showing the characteristics of love that Paul lists. When we fall short, and we will, then we know what to pray for.

If we feed our faith through the means of grace, risk being hopeful, and grow in love then, because we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, we will keep learning, loving, going, and acting. In this way, we will see our vision become our reality and our community will see it too!

#### **Confirmation Classes Forming**

We believe that it is essential for children to receive an education, enabling them to thrive in society. The Bible Study is currently meeting at First UMC and will move to Hope UMC soon.

Invitation to the New Testament, a short-term, in-depth Disciple Bible Study, begins October 11, on Sundays after worship. Maureen Tedesco leads this small group ministry. Daily reading assignments lead the group discussions as we wrestle with the implications of the story of Jesus as it relates to our calling to discipleship and to community. Would you like to commit to a small group study? Please let Pastor Jim know that you are interested. Forming additional small groups for discipleship is crucial to the vision of Hope UMC.

The social justice ministry of Hope Church is starting a new group that will examine our role as Christians in our current world, a world beset with problems of homelessness, immigration, climate change, prejudice, insufficient medical care, etc. We will start each session with a short discussion of current events. We will then relate biblical teachings and events to those events. Finally, we will pray for guidance. We will ask, "What should we do as followers of Jesus?" And then we will do it.

We will strive to establish times and formats that accommodate everyone's needs. All are welcome, and all opinions will be treated with respect. #### **Transition Team Updates**

Teams have been organized to provide key action steps and timelines for transitioning items from First to Hope UMC. The following progress has been communicated:

Property Team – This team has begun relocating items from First UMC to Hope UMC, including the grand piano, bells, chairs in the Narthex, office equipment, and furniture. Painting has been done in the office that will be Pastor Jim's new office. The team is currently prioritizing what will be moved and scheduling when and how to move the items. If anyone is able and willing to help move items from First to Hope, please get in touch with Pete Ward.

Office Team - Completed the removal and archiving of Woodmar's office files.

Kitchen Team – Dishes and other kitchen items have been moved to Hope UMC.

Worship Team – Finalizing the sign for outside, rotating choir loft/piano locations, screen location and upgrade. A new bulletin is in progress. Waiting for the branding to roll out the new bulletin, hopefully on October 26.

#### **Finance**

This report is a summary of the financial activity for First United Methodist Church, Woodmar United Methodist Church and Hope United Methodist Church.

- After receiving the EIN (Employer Identification Number) for Hope UMC, a bank account was opened with BMO for both the church and the Community Preschool and Childcare, with an initial deposit of \$2500 in each account.
- The bank account for FUMC (Old National) and the bank account for Woodmar UMC (BMO) will remain active until 12/31/2025. Beginning 01/01/2026, all financial activity will be conducted using the bank account established at BMO for Hope UMC.
- All financial transactions for expenses for Woodmar UMC and FUMC will be processed from the bank account with BMO for Woodmar UMC. This will make financial reporting for the year-end transactions easier to complete. All financial transactions for expenses and income will be reported as either for Woodmar UMC or FUMC.
- The Proft & Loss (P&L) for September shows a net loss of \$21,658.94. The net loss for each church is: \$11,268.04 for FUMC and \$10,390.90 for Woodmar UMC.
- The net loss for the Community Preschool was \$12,905.88. There was a third payroll of \$13,000 for the month of September.
- FUMC had a September beginning balance in its checking account of \$162,006.09. During the month they received income from Sunday offerings in the amount of \$10,958 plus \$1,544.41 from electronic deposits from Tithe.ly. Finance will work to ensure that all financial transactions have been properly recorded in QuickBooks.
- During the month of September, \$35,000 was transferred from the FUMC checking account to the Woodmar UMC checking account to cover bills for expenses and salaries.
- In June of 2025 FUMC established a foundation account with Heartland Methodist Foundation. The balance in that account as of the end of August is \$203,090.91.
