Looking Back and Looking Ahead

Wow! Another year has come and gone, but it was a year full of change and promise. Let's take a look at a few of the highlights of 2024. (I apologize for any ministries or events that I may have failed to include in these lists.)

- Woodmar and First began worshiping jointly in January, alternating worship locations monthly.
- Together, we averaged 86 people in worship each week.
- We combined the newsletters of our two congregations into a single, monthly publication.
- We baptized Hailey, Marcos, and Ameya and confirmed Ansley, Van, and Bella.
- In addition to our confirmands, we brought Marcos, Maureen, Amanda, Nicole, and Rudy into full professing membership.
- Pastor Pete re-entered retirement and Pastor Jim was appointed to serve both of our churches beginning March 1.
- We started a new worshiping community, launching Messy Church in August.
- Children's Sunday School resumed for the first time since the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Our bell choir, the Praise Bells, has resumed.
- Our missions of The Vine Food Pantry and Brianna's Hope continued to bring the love of Jesus Christ to our community; we collected 10 Cleaning Kits (flood buckets) for UMCOR; and we helped Hammond schools by contributing school supplies, purchasing and stuffing backpacks, and assisting with student registration.
- We opened ourselves up to our community with an August picnic, Thanksgiving dinner, two Trunk or Treats at Halloween, and a Christmas Pageant.
- We joined with other churches in worshiping on Good Friday and Thanksgiving Eve, as well as participating in the National Day of Prayer Breakfast sponsored by Hammond's mayor and the Hammond Faith Based Community and by gathering at Hammond's school administration building to pray for our schools.

I believe that the momentum has shifted from decline toward vibrancy and that 2025 promises to see further positive change.

- While it seems slow, the progress toward the complex task of preparing a proposal to consolidate our two churches is making good progress, and I believe the end of this process is in sight.
- We will continue to support one another in Christian community.
- We will reach more people for Jesus Christ and make a deeper impact in our community.
- Jesus Christ will be with us every step of the way.

We are continuing to collect items for Phil's Friends in a box in the narthex. This worthwhile organization sends helpful items and hope to cancer patients.





Learn About Our Preschool/Childcare

Did you know that Community Preschool and Childcare is Paths to Quality Level 4 and NAEYC Accredited? What does that mean you ask? CP&CC provides high-quality education and care to each child enrolled in our program. Our program is also a liaison for families to crucial resources such as developmental milestone education, parent education, family engagement opportunities, spiritual resources, and much more!

CP&CC also partners with Purdue and Ivy Tech to foster learning opportunities for higher education students in social work and early childhood education. Our program's top priority is to be a safe and nurturing environment where you can leave your most precious assets.

Our staff provides faith-based learning and childcare for families of essential community members such as city workers, teachers, childcare workers, food service, and many more! They say it takes a village to raise a child, and we are in that village, waiting to help each family that steps foot into our wing!

This year, 99.7% of our childcare kiddos receive government funding to pay for childcare. This makes our childcare essential to low-income families. For business-minded individuals, our non-profit business model may not make financial sense. However, we have had seasonal fluctuations in our fiscal year since childcare was established in 2017. We lose money from August to December but make up for it during the rest of the year. This is due to an unavoidable decline in enrollment when our pre-k children move on to kindergarten. Our expenses are also not aligned with the state's fiscal year, so they never accurately represent our profit/loss for the month.

We are working on closing the gap in our end-to-start year losses. For the upcoming year, we are exploring opening a youngeraged classroom, staying open later, and advertising that we will help potty train! These measures are being explored to align with our program's mission of providing preschool and childcare for working families in a Christian environment.

Finance and Administrative

Must Be a Church Member to Vote

When the time comes for us to vote on our merger, only actual members of First and Woodmar United Methodist Churches will be able to vote and it must be in person. It is possible for a person to attend church regularly for years, but still not be a member. Becoming a member usually involves attending a class or classes with the pastor and standing in front of the congregation and making your membership vows. If you are not sure if you are member, please contact the office of the church you have been attending. If you would like to become a member, Pastor Jim is having a New Membership Class (for both First and Woodmar) after worship at Woodmar on January 12.

FUMC Finance News

As of November 30, First Church's giving total for the year to date was \$139,522, which is \$44,466 behind contributions for the first 11 months of 2023. The church is grateful to the First Church Foundation for the contribution in November of \$58,000 of a \$72,000 request to help offset the church's decline in giving projected through year's end. Without this financial assistance from the Foundation, the church's operating expense balance as of November 30 would have reflected a deficit of \$49,113.

The last date for which tithes and offerings can be attributed to 2024 is January 7. If you make a donation between January 1 and January 7 and want it to be counted for last year, be sure to clearly mark 2024 on your envelope. First Church thanks all contributors for your financial support, as well as your significant gifts of service in ministry.

Woodmar UMC Finance News

November ended with expenses over income of \$4,617 with \$21,038 cash in bank. We had offerings of \$9,220. Nothing unusual with the expenses for the month. Year to Date bottom line is a negative \$17,464. Community Preschool had expenses over income of \$8174, with \$82,428 cash in bank. They are working on ideas of cutting costs if we do not get the extra children we need to break even. Hopefully the beginning of the new year will bring in extra children.
